

Simone and Lexroom redefine access to legal knowledge: editorial authority meets Artificial Intelligence

The editorial assets of one of Italy's leading legal publishers are being integrated into an AI-native platform designed for legal professionals. The initiative reflects the ongoing transformation of the legal market, where content, software and artificial intelligence are converging into a single working environment.

Naples/Milan, July 13, 2026 – Legal publishing enters the artificial intelligence ecosystem. Gruppo [Simone](#), a legal publishing company listed on Euronext Growth Milan, is integrating its editorial assets into [Lexroom](#), an artificial intelligence platform used by law firms and legal professionals, marking one of the first examples of **integration between traditional legal publishing and AI-native infrastructure for the legal sector**.

Lexroom will host **a selection of legal and academic publications**, in compliance with applicable copyright laws, to support the study, analysis and application of the law.

The agreement will enable users to **purchase, consult and use specialist editorial content directly within their digital working environment**, without leaving the platform, which is already used by more than 15,000 legal professionals for legal research, document analysis and a wide range of AI-assisted professional activities.

The transaction comes at a time when the legal market is undergoing profound transformation. Whereas **editorial content, legal databases and professional software** have traditionally operated as separate environments, they are increasingly converging **into a single workspace**. The integration of a selection of Gruppo Simone's legal and academic publications into Lexroom's editorial marketplace forms part of **a broader technological transformation that streamlines the transition between legal scholarship, legal research and day-to-day professional practice**, creating a single access point to specialist content and advanced technological tools.

The collaboration is consistent with Gruppo Simone's **strategy of enhancing the value of its proprietary editorial assets through a multi-channel approach**. These proprietary, continuously updated editorial contents represent a distinctive element of the Group's business model and will be distributed through advanced digital channels integrated with technology platforms used by legal professionals.

Making this body of knowledge available within advanced digital environments reinforces its original purpose: to provide tangible support for the study, analysis and application of the law, while opening the way for further future developments of this initiative.”*

This development is reshaping the way professionals and organisations access knowledge and has the potential to transform the legal sector significantly over the coming years.
